Rector's Reflection

In Ecclesiastes (1:2) Solomon writes "utterly meaningless, everything is meaningless", or vanity of vanities. Now Solomon was king over Israel at a time when it was at its height. He commanded power so great that he could afford to do anything he chose. His fame spread far and wide, and all without Instagram, FaceBook, or snapchat. The Queen of Sheba travelled to come to his kingdom and see for herself all the things she had heard. He was wealthy beyond imagination, had a harem full of wives and concubines, had a strong army and had made numerous treaties with wealthy and influential nations around. Yet at the end he says, "meaningless."

Beneath all the surface gloss, Solomon who had asked for and been given the gift of wisdom by God Almighty Himself, was an empty shell. God had blessed him with so much but he had nothing because he did not build his relationship with God. The truth is that separation from God, leaves our life meaningless, and empty.

People try many ways to deal with their need to be accepted, to feel significant and secure but they fail miserably. It is only in Jesus that we have life eternal, full and free. How would you explain to a non-Christian neighbour that ultimately fulfillment and meaning are found only in Jesus Christ?
