Lent Reflection

On Palm Sunday, Jesus rides into Jerusalem and throughout the city the crowds go wild waving palms and shouting, "Hosanna to the Son of David" and "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord". But really no one had a clue or understood that Jesus was riding into Jerusalem with eyes wide open knowing full well that this trip would end in sacrificial death for the sin of humanity.

At Lent study last week, we talked of understanding Jesus or though in this case it was the lack of understanding Jesus! The Disciples **didn't** understand, in Luke 20:1-4 7&8 the religious authorities **refused** to understand. Their problem was that Jesus and **His** authority confronted **their** authority. They challenged Jesus and what they faced is the same for most who come into contact with Jesus.

His authority confronts our authority.

At first, maybe it's just an irritating sermon that makes us a bit uncomfortable. We don't like it, but we brush it aside and continue on with our own agenda. Then, perhaps another encounter with Jesus: A Bible passage which steps on our toes. We realise that if **He** takes over our lives, we will have to make some radical changes, and we're not sure that we want to **give up control.** But He keeps coming back to town and confronting our authority to run our lives. Sooner or later, we have to deal with the question those Jewish religious leaders asked: *"By what authority does Jesus say and do these things?"* The bottom line for them is the same as for people today raising all sorts of questions so that they don't have to face the fact that **He is Lord.**

As we enter the door of Holy Week let us not resemble the crowd who refused to see Jesus as he truly is.

Let's consider the question: Who is Jesus for us? Do we want him to satisfy our selfish wants or is he Lord and Master who gave up his life to save us from our sins?
