Linda's Reflection

Psalm 66:7 "He rules forever by His power, His eyes watch the nations"

From the beginning, right from Genesis 1 the Old Testament proclaims that God is the God of all creation, the maker of heaven and earth, the life giver, the compassionate ruler who brings healing and justice to the nations. The Old Testament proclaims that God is the God of Israel, the covenant-making Lord who has called a particular people as God's own.

Psalm 66 forcefully affirms both of these central truths. In so doing, it shows them to be complementary elements of God's work in the world—not contradictory. God's work for and through God's chosen people serves God's work in redeeming all of creation.

So, let us praise God as creator of all that is, let's praise Him as the giver of meaning and value and grandeur to all that He brings. Let's praise God for being the friend of the dominated and vulnerable, who stands against oppression and in favour of liberation.

As we come closer to a general election this week let us remember Psalm 66:7 "He rules forever by His power, His eyes watch the nations"

Let us then pray for those who will lead, for the incoming government whose discussions determine the future of our land. For those in authority whose words are words that command and control.

Let us pray that God will keep His eyes on this nation that His will, will be done.
