Rector's Reflection

If God were to ask you and me today, "Do you trust me?" I wonder what our response would be? When Jesus spoke to Peter and asked him three times, "Peter, do you love me?" Peter was able to answer "Yes, Lord you know I do." I wonder if Peter was asked, Peter do you trust me?" what his response would be?

It is very easy to speak of our faith in God. We believe in a God who loves us and in a God who sent Jesus as a baby to die for us on the cross. It is not always easy but very doable to put our faith in God. But, and it is a big but, are we able to trust God? The French daredevil Charles Blondin tested the difference with his wheel barrow on a tightrope over the Niagara Chasm at the falls. It was easy to say that the crowd believed he could do it because had they not seen him do it. But it was much more difficult to trust him to get them across safely in his wheel barrow.

God says, "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." (Jer 29:11) It is easy to believe this, especially when he promises us prosperity and hope and a future, free from harm but can we trust Him to carry us through to the end of this plan? What happens when storm clouds break in? Like the disciples we are afraid in a storm tossed boat. "We are going to die Lord" God goes on to say, "Then you will call on me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart. I will be found by you," declares the Lord, "and will bring you back from captivity. Vs 12-13.

Learning to trust God in the deepest seas in the storms of life is far more difficult but exceedingly more fruitful than just having faith in the calm shallows
