Rector's Reflection

During the 11:15 services I am leading a series of sermons entitled "The Primacy of the Bible." Over the last several years (and indeed decades) the authority of the Bible has been increasingly questioned and challenged and this is nowhere more evident than in the pulpit. Since the Garden of Eden the devil has always challenged the truth and reliability of God's word. He comes against the word of God in some very obvious and blatant attacks, as well as in some very subtle and insidious attacks. Even Jesus Himself, the Word of God, was tempted to disbelieve the scriptures or at the very least tempted to believe they are unreliable.

Recent events in the Christian church have shown how even Christian leaders and preachers are tempted to allow our own prejudices and culture to override the message of God's word. I believe the Bible to be God's infallible, unchanging, eternal and complete Word spoken to every generation and culture.

Paul writes to Timothy and tells him that <u>all</u> scripture is inspired by God, that God breathed into it. It is useful, or teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness. In Romans 1:16-17 Paul states, "...I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God that brings salvation to everyone who believes [...] For in the gospel the righteousness of God is revealed—a righteousness that is by faith from first to last, just as it is written: "The righteous will live by faith.""

In today's world where the devil still tries to steal the Word of God from the pulpit and thence from our lives, we need to become those who are convinced of the power of the gospel to salvation.
