Rector's Reflection

Dear all,

Lent literally means spring, the season of the year which sees death change to life. Not simply life, dreary life, but life that is full of vibrancy, colour and sound. Quite simply put it is the season of a full life. As in the physical so it is with the spiritual. Jesus said "I have come that they might have life and have it abundantly." John 10:10 (NRSV) or in all its fullness as the NIV puts it.

In the Gospel reading for this Sunday the 2nd in Lent we read of Nicodemus' encounter with Jesus. Jesus speaks to him of the new birth, being born again. This new life is the result of the movement of the Holy Spirit, the very breath of God. In John 1 we are told "But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God." John 1:12,13 Born where the Spirit of God breathed life. The reason He did this was because He loved the world so much, that He gave Jesus, His only begotten Son, so that in believing we are born again into this new Life.

Next week we will look at the abundant life and discuss the obstacles to it.
